- 1. Campus Conservation Nationals (CCN) is a water and energy reduction competition between colleges and universities across the nation.
- 2. Big Ten Unplugged is a competition within CCN for schools in the Big Ten
- 3. Last year's Big10 Unplugged challenge: All schools were able to track and report on electricity so that's the category we competed in. Some schools were able to track and report on water and did that independently of Big Ten Unplugged.
 - a. Big Ten schools participated:
 - i. University of Minnesota Twin Cities
 - ii. Penn State
 - iii. Michigan State University
 - iv. University of Wisconsin Madison
 - v. Ohio State University
 - vi. University of Nebraska Lincoln
 - vii. University of Illinois at Urbana Champaign
 - b. Penn State University won with an overall 3.3% reduction
 - c. Ohio State placed 2nd with a 3.1% reduction
 - d. University of Wisconsin Madison was 3rd with a 2.2% reduction
- 4. Review of last year's participating schools to update list to reflect this year's participants and additions where needed
- 5. Review timelines for this year
 - a. November 7th was the last day to sign up for CCN but email them if you haven't already signed up!
 - b. Letter of commitment due December 19th
 - c. Stacey White with University of Minnesota will sign up all schools for Big Ten Unplugged after we confirm all schools participating (December 19th is the last day to sign up for group competition)
 - d. February 1 April 30: CCN competition. Track 2-3 weeks for baseline; then 3 weeks of data for the competition
